**Call to Order:** David Plotts called the meeting to order at 5:40 pm at Waterside Park.

**Waterside Park Improvements:** The Committee walked around the park and discussed the improvement plans of adding parking, a community garden, and multi-purpose sports field. The Committee noted the new basketball courts, which will be painted this spring.

The Committee discussed:

- Water access for non-motorized boats, and concluded that it would not be feasible.
- Fencing – there should be fencing between the church and multi-purpose field, to contain balls and prohibit vehicles from entering the grassed area. More fencing would be needed to keep balls from entering the water, near the basketball court.
- Bathroom – bathroom facilities need to be added

Other ideas for improvement include:

- Trees – additional needed by the grills and picnic tables
- A geese management plan
- A single disc golf basket, for a putting game
- An additional trash can between multi-purpose field and basketball court
- Bike rack
- Crosswalk at Marine Rd.
- Moving the park sign to the new vehicle new entrance
- Connecting existing sidewalk in the playground to the new parking lot, for ADA access.

**Minutes:** Minutes from February 21 were distributed. A motion to approve was made by Mike Perry, seconded by Chris Roberts, and carried.

**Other Business:** David Plotts and Mike Perry updated the Committee on Naylor Mill Park, which will be renamed Naylor Mill Forest Trails with a ribbon cutting tentatively in May. New signage is being worked on by the City.

With no other business, a motion to adjourn was made by Mike Perry, seconded by Chris Roberts, and carried to adjourn at 6:10 pm.
